William Clay "Bill Buck" Jarrells, age 91, of Sandy Hook, Kentucky, passed away Sunday, morning, January 24, 2010, at the Elliott County Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Sandy Hook, Kentucky.

He was born September 13, 1918, in Elliott County, Kentucky, a son of the late William Addison and Maude Adkins Jarrells.
